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About Ahmedabad University

Located in one of India's most vibrant cities, Ahmedabad University(AU) is a private, non-profit, liberal education driven, research university rapidly developing into a serious center for scholarship. Since its inception in 2009, the University has made strides through global collaborative research, broad based contextual and flexible curriculum, project-based learning, and industry linkages thus creating a unique learning environment. The University puts special emphasis on experiential learning and provides opportunities for commercializing innovation and start-ups. Ahmedabad University offers undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral programs in a wide variety of areas including management, life sciences, engineering, and computer studies. We will introduce undergraduate and graduate programs in Arts and Sciences starting 2018; these will be both broad in exposure and deep in learning.

Ahmedabad University was founded by the Ahmedabad Education Society (AES), a non-profit educational trust. AES was established over 80 years ago at the behest of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the first Home Minister of India by illustrious leaders like Kasturbhai Lalbhai, the doyen of the Indian textile industry; Ganesh Mavalankar, the first Speaker of the Indian Parliament, the Lok Sabha; and Amrutlal Hargovandas, one of the doyen industrialists of Ahmedabad, with the purpose of advancing education in Gujarat and through its institutions, throughout India and the world. AES and the leaders therein have played significant roles in the founding of national institutions like IIM Ahmedabad, National Institute of Design, Physical Research Laboratory, and CEPT. The Trust is also responsible for supporting institutions of repute like MG College of Science, LD College of Arts, HL College of Commerce, LM College of Pharmacy, AG Teacher's College, and Institute of Indology, amongst others.

Ahmedabad University is the youngest AES institution and is managed by an independent Board of Governors. Ahmedabad University is a community of scholars and practitioners who believe in the value of original enquiry and its application for the benefit of the society. The University is committed to providing financial support to admitted students who have a demonstrated need. We offer worldwide exposure to our students and faculty through tie-ups with leading international educational institutions. Our partners, some of the most innovative in their fields of specialization, are helping us build unique strengths. They include US based Olin College of Engineering for advancing project based learning at the University particularly in our Engineering programs; the Executive Education, Judge Business School at Cambridge University engaging with our Entrepreneurial MBA program; Stanford University's Centre for Design Research developing a unique coaching and design of enterprise methodology at our Venture Studio; and the University of Valladolid in Spain and University of Ferrara in Italy partnering with our Centre of Heritage Management to build programs and research activities in the area of heritage.

Ahmedabad, a 600 year old city, is India's official entry to the World Heritage City selection by UNESCO. It is one of the most secure and safe cities with one of the best infrastructures in the country; it has strong intellectual energy and entrepreneurial spirit, and has a high potential for employment for young people. Ahmedabad University has a center-of-city location in a major metropolis, has the DNA of highly reputed institutions and founders, is part of a best-in-country institutional community with significant available talent, and has aspirations to create an impact in the society through its scholarship and its students.

Policies and Practices

Admission Policy

Ahmedabad University has adopted a policy of admission that is 'Means Blind and Merit Based', which aims at providing equal opportunity to all. The University firmly believes that students securing admission on merit should not be denied access to education on account of monetary constraints. Adhering to this philosophy, admissions to all the undergraduate programmes have been purely based on merit. Admissions to the Engineering and Computer Studies programmes are finalized by the Admission Committee for Professional Programmes, a Committee set up by the State Government. Admissions to all other programmes are done by the University administration. The University admits Non Resident Indians (NRIs) and foreign students in all its programmes.

Financial Aid Policy

Ahmedabad University provides support to economically disadvantaged students who are encouraged to apply for partial/full fee remission. The University is committed to extending financial support and the best of facilities.

Innovation in Teaching Methodology

Innovation in teaching and pedagogy has been at the core of the philosophy of the University. The highly up-to-date teaching fraternity adopts a research-centric focus. Teaching has evolved from mere classroom monologues to discussions, leading to innovations at the grassroots level and adding value to human life. With these objectives in mind, the faculty at the institute is in constant pursuit of skill enhancement and overall development.

The faculty believes that teaching is a collaborative learning process. Accordingly, regular classroom sessions are enhanced by practical and application based learning, extensive use of multimedia, and interactive discussion-oriented lectures. The University also adopts a system of continuous learning and evaluation, supported by extensive computer laboratory sessions, assignments, case studies, role playing sessions, presentations and tutorials for slow learners. Current business articles from newspapers, magazines and journals are also used for discussions as part of the learning process.

The University periodically organizes workshops, seminars and guest lectures by leading professionals, to expose students to the industry and practical aspects of Management. The institutes also organize industrial visits to leading business establishments in Gujarat.

Report from the Chairman, Board of Management*



The following is a report on the activities of Ahmedabad University from July 2014 to June 2015. The University continues to grow both in size and quality. It is being recognized as an important centre of academic activity in Gujarat as many new initiatives are being put in place, many of them for the first time in the country. Among the notable initiatives this year, the Centre for Heritage Management has introduced a Master's degree programme in Heritage Management, the first of its kind in India.

The Entrepreneurial MBA programme has been reviewed and its duration has been extended from 15 months to two years. The University finalized its partnership agreement with Olin College of Engineering, Boston, USA. Olin is a private, undergraduate Engineering College ranked No. 3 in the US News and World Report, 2015 and its educational programs are based on Project based Learning. In addition to partnerships with the University of Valladolid and University of Ferrara, this new association with the Olin School and the University of Bradford will support our ambition to work closely with individuals and institutions that have specialized expertise in areas of our interest. We plan to offer five new courses at the University viz. Social Media, Art of Persuasion, Entrepreneurship, Change Management, and Design Thinking. We ran multiple venture batches at VentureStudio and launched several activities to strengthen the startup ecosystem including Ahmedabad Angel Network, Ahmedabad Venture Alliance, and the VentureStudio Speaker series. At VentureStudio, we also formulated unique fellowship programmes with credits for the University students to enable them to start their ventures by the time they are in their final year.

We have added 1500 students to our students' strength with the current enrollment at the University at a little over 4500. Since our Admission is based on merit based need blind, we have liberalized our Scholarship scheme. Our motto is to ensure that no one is denied the opportunity of good education due to lack of financial resources. Our overall faculty strength is 130 and we are devoting a great deal of attention to faculty recruitment. During the year, the University has seen visits by UGC & AICTE Committees; it has undergone the AAA accreditation while the NAAC accreditation process is underway. Research and Publication has become an integral part of our faculty performance appraisal. This year faculty members have published 69 papers in international journals and have attended 68 international conferences. ILS received grants worth Rs.1.37 Crore during the year while IET received research grants of Rs. 67 Lac.

I joined Ahmedabad University on October 16th 2015. It is an honour for me to step into the shoes of the founding Chairman of the Board, Shri Prafull Anubhai who very assiduously laid the foundation of the University with a grand vision of becoming an impactful institution locally and globally. The University recognizes this courageous work of Shri Anubhai and thanks him for bringing us on this path of meaningful contribution. The University also thanks Professor Shailendra Mehta, the Provost, who resigned from the University and is grateful to him for his leadership and providing us with valuable direction including the emphasis on embedding our programmes with more humanistic courses.

I am donning two hats on my head, one that of the Chairman, Board of Management and the other as the Provost. It is a matter of great prestige to serve Ahmedabad University and I will strive my best to help us reach the University of our dreams. We are now six years old with a unique identity. The ambition to become a global player in the education sector drives us constantly to attain our goals. Our graduates have acceptability in the market and encouraged by that we add value to our programs. The drivers of all programmes continue to be value based leadership, technology-enhanced project-based active learning, market centric curricula and an aiding commitment to society.

Academic Programmes

Amrut Mody School of Management

B. K. Majumdar Institute of Business Administration (BKMIBA)

- **BBA**

BKMIBA is working towards nurturing excellence by providing the highest standards in business education. Keeping diverse industry requirements and enhanced employability prospects in mind, BKMIBA offers a one of its kind Bachelor of Business Administration Degree with dual specialization in Marketing, Finance, Human Resources, Entrepreneurship and Economics. It provides students a comprehensive understanding of distinct specialized courses with practical insights and helps in developing their professional competence.

- **BBA Honors**

A unique opportunity, the first of its kind in Gujarat is available to advanced learners of the BBA programme in BKMIBA. A fast track BBA Honors programme has been designed to enable the students to earn 40 more additional credits. Based on merit and an interview, a limited number of students who have excelled in FYBBA will be selected for the BBA Honors programme which has 11 additional courses including Foreign Language, Summer Training, and Applied Research Work. Students passing out with a BBA Honors Degree, if selected in the MBA programme of Ahmedabad University, will be eligible for limited course waivers and credit transfers to the MBA programme leading to a fast track MBA.

- **Integrated MBA Programme**

BKMIBA, in addition to offering Bachelors in Business Administration has also started offering a five year Integrated MBA (iMBA) programme for management education aspirants. Drawing upon its rich experience of providing the undergraduate students with a plethora of avenues to maximize personal and professional growth for more than a decade, BKMIBA through its iMBA programme intends to offer a blend of market oriented courses which assist in the creation of viable employment or entrepreneurial opportunities.

H. L. Institute of Commerce (HLIC)

- **B.Com.**

The three year Bachelor of Commerce programme at HLIC is contemporary, practice oriented, and focused towards multifaceted development of students. It offers Accounting as the major subject with appropriate concentration in other subjects like Business Organization and Management, Law and Taxation, Statistics, Economics, English and Business Communication. Besides Business Ethics, foreign languages are also a part of the curriculum. Over and above the multiple general electives to choose from all through the three years, the Institute offers specialization in the final year of studies in Law, Taxation, and Banking, Financial Services and Insurance (BFSI).

Amrut Mody School of Management (AMSoM)

- **MBA**

The two year Master of Business Administration programme covers general and compulsory subjects in the first year. The second year consists of core courses, area specific compulsory courses and elective courses with specializations in finance, marketing, human resource and general management. Information Systems (IS) is offered as a minor elective. In order to make the MBA programme market-oriented and truly relevant to the present industry requirements, the Institute has introduced several new courses with inputs from the academic and corporate world. An indicative list of the courses introduced are Bank Management, Fixed Income Securities Analysis, Pharmaceutical Marketing, Marketing Engineering, Public Relations, Retail Marketing, Achievement Motivation and Assertiveness Training, Training and Development, Internet and E-Commerce, Database Management, Corporate Communication and Culture, Business Ethics, Data Computing, New Enterprise Financing, Selection and Testing, and Personal Effectiveness. Students are required to take up Individual Social Responsibility Initiative (ISRI) as part of their curriculum and Internships at the end of the first year with the requirement of a report submission to the Institution at the end of the training.

- **EMBA**

A full time two year programme, the Entrepreneurial MBA is specially designed and developed for aspiring entrepreneurs and family business leaders. The programme aims at strengthening one's abilities to overcome the challenges of family driven businesses. To the aspiring entrepreneur, this programme is an onerous learning platform that ingrains the confidence and ability to ideate, strategize, and develop a business model. To ensure the right outcomes through the course curriculum, all the courses have been developed keeping in center the course philosophy which revolves around three R's: Rigor, Relevance, and Relationships. The courses offer projects and theories that are relevant to the participants' businesses, in a rigorous manner with high involvement of family, faculty, and industry mentors. It provides an education of international standards that prepares participants for success in a collaborative learning environment, with relevant projects and business experiences locally as well as at Cambridge University.

School of Computer Studies

AES Institute of Computer Studies (AESICS)

- **Integrated MCA Programme**

The five year Integrated Dual Degree MCA programme was introduced in 2013. On successful completion of the programme, students are conferred Master's degrees in Computer Applications (MCA) and have the option to leave the programme after three years with a BCA degree.

- **MCA**

The three year Master of Computer Applications programme is offered with the option of lateral entry into Second Year MCA for students who have completed BCA/B.Sc. (IT/Computer Science). This programme is a blend of professional and academic learning that equips students with the skills and training to become quality IT professionals. Students undertake rigorous academic work and intensive project work in the industry, enhanced with value added workshops and seminars.

Students in their third Semester are offered a specialization in any one area of interest like Mobile Computing, Artificial Intelligence, Database, Multimedia and Computer Graphics, Data and Network security, Open Source Applications and Enterprise Resource Planning Applications, and Collaborative Work System Applications. Students are required to undertake Software Development Projects in the final year and develop software for various applications.

School of Science and Technology

Institute of Engineering and Technology (IET)

- **B.Tech. (Information and Communication Technology)**

A four year full time programme, the Bachelor of Technology in Information and Communication Technology is a blend of computer science, tele-communications, electronics, signal processing, along with Mathematics, Physics, Design, Humanities and Social Sciences. It has the provision of offering a dual degree in B.Tech. and M.Tech. after five years. The first two and a half years of the curriculum consist of core courses which effectively combine the above areas. Students are later allowed to specialize in areas like Information Security, Data Analytics, Information Retrieval, Human Computer Interaction, Cloud Computing, Machine Learning, Bio-informatics, Bio-medical Instrumentation, Mobile Computing, Wireless and Mobile Communications, VLSI Design, Sensor Networks, etc.

- **B.Tech. (Chemical Engineering)**

A four year full time programme, the innovative Bachelor of Technology in Chemical Engineering reflects contemporary chemical engineering practices and industry needs. Along with learning the foundations of the discipline, the students also learn how to solve real-world chemical engineering problems by developing extensive computer software skills and designing and configuring data networks. Programme work and projects are offered in cutting-edge areas including nanotechnology, thin films, advanced unit processes, and biochemical technology. Students do hands-on project work in process data acquisition and control with microcontrollers; they use industry-standard process simulators and other chemical engineering software tools to deepen their knowledge and develop advanced skills needed by the industry.

- **B.Tech. (Mechanical Engineering)**

The four year Bachelor of Technology in Mechanical Engineering programme not only delivers training in classical mechanical engineering, but also emphasizes on mechatronics – designing mechanical systems with embedded electronics. With skills honed by challenging projects throughout the curriculum, students graduate from their programme fully industry-ready with the ability to make an immediate impact in the workplace.

- **M.Tech. (Information and Communication Technology)**

The two year Master of Technology programme in ICT was launched in 2014 with specialization in Data Science and Analytics. This hands-on, live case study based programme is designed to meet

the exploding need for highly skilled professionals in Data Analytics. The programme combines applied mathematics, statistics, computer science and various business domains or verticals like finance, marketing, supply chain, agriculture, e-commerce etc. In today's increasingly competitive marketplace, organizations need individuals with the requisite skills to transform the growing amount of industry, product, and customers' behavioral data into actionable information to support strategic and tactical decision making. The focus is on how "big data" can be used to help decision makers improve organizational competitiveness.

Institute of Life Sciences (ILS)

- **M.Sc. (Life Sciences)**

The 2 year Master of Science programme is focused on multi-disciplinary research based learning with emphasis on individual projects and experiments in state-of-the-art laboratories. Each student gets individual hands-on training in current techniques used in life sciences such as PCR, Flow Cytometry, DNA and protein purification and separation, nucleic acid and protein blotting, ELISA and animal and plant cell culture. Apart from this, emphasis is also given on in-silico biology including molecular modeling, docking and other bioinformatics tools. It includes topics such as: Product design and innovation, OMIC technologies (genomics, proteomics and metabolomics), Sensors and chips, Ethical, legal and social issues in Life Sciences. Selected candidates are allowed to pursue 1 year full-time research in the 3rd and 4th semester.

- **Integrated M.Sc. Programme (Life Sciences)**

The five year Integrated Master of Science programme launched in 2014 aims to impart a sound understanding of the basics in life sciences, an aptitude for research, and an ability to undertake diverse and challenging career opportunities in industry and academia. It is designed to provide quality education in life sciences at an early stage to inculcate interest in innovation, scientific, and industrial research. It is also designed to encourage professional development in the chosen area of life sciences through in-depth knowledge, hands-on training and prepare students for advanced research careers. The students can specialize in Microbiology, Biochemistry, or Biotechnology through project work and research.

Centre for Heritage Management (CHM)

CHM offers a Master of Management Studies (MMS) in Heritage Management (HM) which aims to empower its students to professionally manage heritage assets in a financially-viable and sustainable manner. The two year long programme curriculum is based on experiential learning rather than conventional teaching, which differentiates its heritage managers from a typical management school aspirant. It attempts to build knowledge, impart skills, and nurture passion for heritage. The programme can be pursued by people aspiring to serve various sectors of heritage management in India and abroad, with a minimum of a Bachelor's degree in arts, architecture, archaeology, business, commerce, culture, history, museum studies etc. The course demands demonstrated experience or inclination to undertake a profession in heritage management.

VentureStudio

VentureStudio is a venture design and incubation centre, established by Ahmedabad University in October 2011 in collaboration with the Center for Design Research at Stanford University. Based on a design-thinking approach, VentureStudio programmes lead aspiring entrepreneurs to arrive at a viable product or service, through the process of concept definition, market identification, stakeholder and contextual research, and then focus on execution speed to help them set up the initial venture structure, take the product to its lead customers and scale it up. It offers a six-month fellowship programme along with other varied programmes for aspiring entrepreneurs from Ahmedabad. Since its establishment, VentureStudio has coached 50 entrepreneurs and launched 11 commercial ventures. VentureStudio has also created a strong ecosystem of mentors to support potential entrepreneurs, including investors, mentors, industrialists, and professionals, and academic and research leaders. VS provides a very creative and collaborative working space. It also facilitates funding support at seed, angel and VC levels through close association with partners. VS is an approved nodal agency under the Government of Gujarat start-up scheme. It is an approved Technology Business Incubator under the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India and works closely with other institutes like CIIE- IIMA, IIT-Gn, TiE, NID, iCreate, EDI etc., to develop the Ahmedabad and Gujarat venture ecosystem.

Physiotherapy College for the Visually Impaired

- **Diploma in Physiotherapy**

The Diploma in Physiotherapy for the visually impaired is conducted at two centres: Physiotherapy College for the Visually Impaired originally set up by the Deaf Mute Society, Ahmedabad, and Physiotherapy Department, Blind People Association, Ahmedabad. Visually challenged students from all over India are eligible for admission on completion of Standard 12 examinations with English as a subject. The selection is done only after a detailed assessment. The faculty uses the standard lecture method for teaching. All these lectures are recorded live on computers using the latest sound recording software. This enables the students to refer to this data at any time after the class. The writer based exams often lead to unsatisfactory results as the writer chosen may not be good in handwriting or is often unfamiliar with the medical terminology and may not write the paper in the required speed. Hence, the examinations are conducted using the multiple choice question formats on a computer.

Doctoral Programme

The University launched the Doctoral Programme in Management for both full time and part time PhDs for working professionals. The doctoral programme is as of now limited to Amrut Mody School of Management and the School of Science and Technology. An all India level common admission test and interview is conducted for enrolling students to the doctoral programme. However, in case of NET/SET/GATE/JRF qualified candidates, and also those who possess M.Phil. Qualification, there are personal interviews. The University has already constituted a Doctoral Programme Committee (DPC) with very eminent academicians to take the programme forward. This committee lays out guidelines for conducting the doctoral programmes in a suitable manner and reviews the work done in this area. The constitution of members of the Doctoral Committee for 2014-15 are Professor Shailendra Mehta, Professor A. H. Kalro, Professor Chetan Parikh, Professor Bhavesh Patel, and Professor Alok Dhawan. Generally, applications are invited from candidates twice in a year and the classes are scheduled from July every year.

New Initiatives

- To fulfil its mission of adopting green field initiatives, Ahmedabad University has built a robust control framework encompassing all major functions. Research Grants

Ahmedabad University Convocation Ceremony



The fourth convocation ceremony of Ahmedabad University (AU) was held on 15th November, 2014 at the University's Amrut Mody School of Management. Although the unseasonal rains tried to play spoilsport, the Ahmedabad University Students' Events and Activities Committee (AUSEAC) team and volunteers ensured that the setback was overcome in no time and the evening carried on flawlessly. The Chief Guest, Shri Deepak Parekh, Chairman HDFC Ltd., conferred graduation degrees to 1153 students; these included 115 MBA students, 9 EMBA students, 20 M. Pharm. students, 9 M.Sc. students, 54 MCA students, 143 BCA students, 24 BBA (Hons.) students, 166 BBA students and 613 B.Com students.

In his address, Shri Deepak Parekh touched upon the role of education and youth in the country's growth and said the education sector needs privatization as it is vital to India's progress and gave AU's example. 

CHM Bags EU Funded Project

On the auspicious day of Dussehra, Ahmedabad University inaugurated the swanky Institute of Engineering and Technology building designed by the Delhi based vir.mueller architects with a Green Building concept. The building has Agra Red Stone installed on the exterior walls and large corridors for easy passage of air and retaining of

direct sunlight. It is also equipped with a state-of-the-art rain water harvesting system that can store 10 Lac liters of rainwater and cater to the drinking water requirement for a year. The building's estimated value is Rs. 74 Crores and is built up in an area of 2.45 Lac Square Feet with a seating capacity of 2500 students.



UGC Panel Visits AU

A seven member expert team headed by Professor Anil K. Tyagi visited AU in November for a formal inspection to ensure full compliance of UGC's Private University Acts and Regulations. The UGC experts inspected AU's infrastructure and facilities and interacted with faculty, staff and students. Founding of Shri Shrenikbhai Chair Professorship

It was a big loss for AU when Shri Shrenikbhai Kasturbhai Lalbhai passed away on June 19, 2014. He was the former long serving Chairman of Ahmedabad Education Society. Shri Shrenikbhai was an eminent industrialist, noted philanthropist, and a man of multi-faceted talents. In his honor, AU has instituted a Chair Professorship, the 'Shrenik Lalbhai Chair Professor of Management of Social Institutions' which invites professors from India and abroad to apply. Professor Howard Spodek, Professor of History, Temple University, USA was chosen as the inaugural Shrenik Lalbhai Chair Professor of the Management of Social Organizations. Professor Spodek's main field of research has been the history and current functioning of the city of Ahmedabad. In addition to dozens of scholarly articles and two documentary films relating to the city, Professor Spodek has published "Ahmedabad: Shock City of Twentieth Century India" (Indiana University Press, 2011; Orient Blackswan, 2012). For many years, Professor Spodek has also been active in formulating and teaching the field of World History; he is the author of "The World's History" (Pearson, 5th edition, 2015).

- Navratri (Ghummar) was celebrated with great fervor on 26th September at IET. The students, faculty and staff matched their steps to great music and made it an event to remember forever.







ILS


- ILS celebrated its second Annual Day on 1st October. ILS has instituted an ILS-Oration session to be delivered by an eminent scientist every year. The oration carries a citation and an honorarium of Rupees Fifty Thousand. Dr. Balram Bhargava, Professor of Cardiology at the prestigious All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi and the Executive Director for Stanford India Bio design Centre, delivered the 2nd ILS-Oration titled “Frugal Innovation India’s Most Valued Resource”. The lecture focused on the landscape of medical device innovation in India and emphasized the power of interdisciplinary collaboration between doctors, engineers, designers and entrepreneurs.
- ILS organized a science camp under the auspices of Department of Science and Technology, Government of India sponsored Innovation in Science Pursuit for Inspired Research (INSPIRE) programme during 3rd-7th November. This camp aimed to motivate young students from Ahmedabad to take up a career in science. 130 students from 21 schools attended the camp. More than 15 eminent scientists including Fellows of various science academies and mentors delivered lectures and interacted with the students. Visits were organized for the interaction of students with eminent scientists at Physical Research Laboratory, Ahmedabad Textile Industries Research Association (ATIRA), and

Science City. The inaugural lecture “From Genome to Epigenome” was delivered by Prof. Sanjeev Galande, IISER, Pune. In this talk, he discussed about genome, human genome project and epigenome and explained how research on epigenome contributes to the treatment of diseases. Another coveted speaker Prof. S. Ramaswami evoked considerable excitement amongst the participants on the fun of doing science. An exciting introduction to Nanotechnology was presented by Prof. Jayesh Bellare, IIT Mumbai with emphasis on the amazing nanotech and its applications in the health-care sector. The students took a tour of ‘Centres of Excellence’ at Institute of Life Sciences including in silico, Imaging & Flow Cytometry demonstrations on sophisticated instruments. Students were exposed to ‘hands-on’ in microbiology, cell culture techniques and in silico tools. The students were motivated to submit research projects as “amateur scientists” and three of the seven participants were awarded a token prize.

- An international conference on Translational Nanomedicine (T-NANO 2014) was jointly organized by ILS along with CSIR National Physical Laboratory, New Delhi and Northeastern University; Boston, USA under the auspices of IUSSTF funded Indo-US joint Center on Nanomedicine for Head and Neck Cancer during 15th-17th, December. The Inaugural Address was delivered by Professor Shailendra Mehta, Provost, Ahmedabad University. Professor Rena Bizios, University of Texas, USA delivered the Keynote Address, “Nanostructured Biomaterials for Implant Applications: Potential, Challenges and Opportunities”. The conference received support from IUSSTF, Ahmedabad University, GICT, DST, ICMR, DBT and Indian Nanoscience Society. More than 150 participants from



different countries namely USA, UK, Germany, Australia, Singapore and India attended the conference. 36 invited presentations were delivered in 7 scientific sessions and 94 poster presentations were made and published as an Abstract Book. The panel discussion on “Global Nanomedicine Academy: Teaching and Outreach”, Student-Scientist Interaction, Poster presentation and the panel discussion for recommendations of the conference were the most sought after components of T NANO 2014. In the valedictory function, Dr. Mukul Jain, Senior Vice President, Zydus Research Center; Shri Prafullbhai, Chairman, BoM, Ahmedabad University; and Dr. P.S. Chauhan, Chairman, ICMR Taskforce on Nanomedicine conferred the 12 best poster awards to the students and Certificates of Appreciation to volunteers.

- ILS in collaboration with Douglas Connect, Switzerland organized an International Workshop on “Computational Drug Design and Methods & Applications” from 5th to 9th January. This five day comprehensive workshop aimed at providing a set of stimulating sessions using the latest advanced modeling techniques of relevance to chemists, life scientists and modelers working in drug discovery. The emphasis of the workshop was to give hands-on training to the participants along with the presentations and lectures. The presentations on the advanced issues in computational

drug discovery were followed by discussions and hands-on training with case studies. Ten researchers from industry and academia of different states of India participated in the workshop. Dr. Barry Hardy, Managing director Douglas Connect, Switzerland provided an overview of the programme activities for the Computational Drug Design and Methods & Applications (eCheminfo India 2015) workshop. Dr. Alessandro Contini from University of Milan talked about different ways of library preparation before docking analysis. He discussed how molecular diversity is not the only essential feature in a synthetically feasible library. Dr. Ravi Kumar Muttineni, Application Scientist, Schrodinger, delivered his talk on the importance of 3D structures from the perspective of protein-ligand interactions in structure-based drug design. Professor Indira Ghosh, , Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, explained the theory of free energy calculation using AMBER and also explained free energy calculation for PFPKS of Plasmodium falciparum with its ligand. Dr. Sami Mukhopadhyay, Principal Application Scientist, Novalead Pharma Pvt. Ltd., Pune introduced quantitative structure-activity relationship (QSAR) analysis and its usefulness in high-throughput screening. Overall the workshop reached the expected outcomes with the participants’ appreciation and need for the eCheminfo workshops in the future.



- ILS celebrated the National Science Day on 28th February under the aegis of National Academy of Sciences, India (Ahmedabad Chapter). The National Science Day is organized to celebrate the discovery of the Raman Effect on 28th February, 1928 by the Noble laureate Sir C.V. Raman. The theme for this year's National Science Day was "Science

for Nation Building". Dr. Rajendra Rane, Ex-Vice President, Medical Department, Intas Pharmaceuticals Ltd., Ahmedabad, delivered a lecture and probed the curiosity of students by explaining very lucidly the mechanistic aspects of treatment of various diseases with different medicines and the importance of clinical trials for establishment of a drug as a medicine. He also explained the role of microbes in different diseases and highlighted the importance of basic understanding of life sciences. In the National Science Day celebrations, the students participated in scientific cartoon, essay and quiz competitions and prizes were awarded to the best performers.

- ILS students organized the first Annual Cultural Festival "Aarambh" from 19th to 21st March.

CHM

- After careful planning and intense preparation of almost two years, CHM launched its Master of Management Studies in Heritage Management programme by declaring admissions open on 16th February. The programme was conceptualized as a strategic contribution to the need felt by the heritage sector for a management-oriented approach. The course design of the two-year programme

carefully integrates domain specific knowledge from both the heritage and management disciplines, and carefully strategizes the delivery of the programme in real life context through its curricular components. Three major areas are identified for emphasis in the overall curriculum. Heritage study remains central along with applications of management insights, supported by skills development.



The curriculum will be delivered through innovative methodologies like field studies and immersion, internship, volunteer work, specialization courses and thesis or project work. The inaugural seminar with the newly inducted session began on 29th June post which regular classes began from 6th July.



- CHM in collaboration with the Centre for Cultural Resources and Training (CCRT), New Delhi organized an intensive six day programme, Art, Culture and Heritage: A Management Perspective. The programme was held from 26th-31st January at the Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad (IIMA). The programme was open to representatives of government departments, cultural and heritage organizations, local bodies and municipal corporations, as well as the NGOs working in the field of Art, Culture or Heritage. The response to the course was overwhelming and CHM got more than 60 applications from across the country from senior level experts, practitioners and representatives of government and selected 32 participants in the end. The talk on "Collection Management" was led by Ruchira Ghose of Craft Museum, New Delhi and Sabyasachi Mukherjee of CSMVS, Mumbai while "Managing of Performing Arts and Music" was dealt with by Smt. Mallika Sarabhai, Darpana Academy and Shri Prafull Anubhai, Chairman, BoM,

Ahmedabad University and Advisor, Saptak School of Music. Heritage Landscapes was led by Shikha Jain of DRONAH and the area of Cultural Tourism and Integrated Area Planning was handled by Aman Nath of Neemrana Hotels and practicing architects Kulbhusan and Meera Jain. Debashish Nayak of CHM talked about Heritage Walk as a Management tool. The management aspects were dealt with by Professor Emeritus of Ahmedabad University and former Director of IIMK Prof. A. H. Kalro and the heritage sector was dealt with by Shri Ashoke Chatterjee of Craft Council of India. Field experiences were created through the iconic heritage walk through the old city of Ahmedabad and visits to the Sabarmati Gandhi Ashram, Modhera Sun Temple, and the UNESCO World Heritage Site, Rani ki Vav.

- A new website www.ahmedabadheritagecluster.com for the Ahmedabad Cultural Heritage Cluster was launched on the occasion of World Heritage Day on 18th April with the cooperation of Casa de la India in Spain. . The website provides detailed information on the EU-funded project of Ahmedabad Cultural Heritage Management and Venture lab which aims to develop a Cultural Heritage Cluster and a Heritage Venture lab in the city. This website is in addition to www.indianet.es which provides a collaborative virtual tool where documents and news are uploaded.
- CHM organized three master class training programmes on 17th and 18th April. The classes were organized as part of the European Union-funded project on establishment of a Cultural Heritage Management Cluster Organization and Venture Lab. Out of the three master classes, two were on Built Heritage Management and the third one was on Cultural Heritage related Events Management. The Spanish faculty members joined the programme as experts from the



associate partners of CHM in the European Union project – Casa de la India Spain, University of Valladolid and City Council of Valladolid, Spain. Prof. Julio Grijalba and Prof. Alberto Grijalba, faculty members of architecture in the University of Valladolid were two experts who shared their expertise with the participants for the first two classes. The other faculty members were Shri Debashish Nayak and Dr. Neel Chapagain from CHM. Mr. P. K. V. Nair from Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation which is the Indian partner in the project as well as Ms. Manvita Baradi, Director of Urban Management Centre and Rajiv Patel, Director, City Heritage Centre were also present as speakers. The class on Cultural Heritage related Events Management was conducted by Guillermo Rodriguez, the Director of Casa de la India, Spain and Juan Manuel Guimerans, the DG of Culture, Tourism and

Commerce of Valladolid Municipal Council in Spain. The Indian expert joining the class was Ms. Sharupa Dutta, Director of Creative Arts and a theatre artiste herself from Teamworks Art India, Delhi. She also manages the Jaipur Literature festival among other events.

- As part of its ongoing project funded by the European Union, a public event to launch the Ahmedabad Cultural Heritage Cluster (ACHC) and the Ahmedabad Heritage Venture Lab (AHVL) was held on 7th December by CHM along with Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC), and 3 Spanish partners, City Council of Valladolid, University of Valladolid and Casa de la India. The event was attended by the Mayor of Ahmedabad, Smt. Minaxiben Patel and the Deputy Head of Mission in Embassy of Spain, New Delhi H.E. Ms. Magdalena Cruz Yabar among other dignitaries. It was held at the Ahmedabad Municipal Commission's Civic Centre at Ellisbridge, Law Garden. The Municipal Commissioner of Ahmedabad, Ms. D. Thara, IAS; Mr. Guillermo Rodriguez, Director, Casa de la India in Spain; Prof. Shailendra Mehta, Provost, AU; Shri C. K. Koshy, CEO; and Shri Debashish Nayak, Director, CHM were among other dignitaries.
- A Round Table Conference on "Heritage, Crafts and Tourism: Promoting Collaborations,



Creating New Business Opportunities” was held at Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation on 9th September. Representatives of major partners of the EU project currently being carried out by CHM, namely, Casa de la India, Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation and Ahmedabad University, and associate partners Urban Management Centre and City Heritage Centre attended the programme. A cross section of Ahmedabad based NGOs, academia, government bodies, as well as cultural heritage business stakeholders also participated in the conference.

- The Cultural Heritage Management and Venture Lab funded by the EU mandate a clustering process, format and strategy of mapping, socio-economic survey and analysis of stake holders in the heritage eco system of Ahmedabad. The process involved listing out of entities, organizations, and agencies that are already part of the eco-system, listing out new enterprises/entities, and stakeholder mapping through socio-economic survey and interviews. As the researchers and the

EU-project team of CHM conducted these processes of clustering, a series of validation events were undertaken among stakeholders to understand the depths, achievements and challenges of the processes. The sectors covered in the validation process were: on 29th November, Performing arts cluster, on 28th November, Ashavali sarees cluster, and on 25th November, Tourism, Media and Kite making cluster.

- Mr. Vijay Ramchandani, a project functionary of the EU-funded Cultural Heritage Management and Venture Lab Project and Mr. Tomas Garabito of Casa de la India, Spain participated in an International seminar on “Cultural and Creative Industries and Youth: A Chance for Each Other” at Johannesburg, South Africa from 9th to 10th September. The seminar was organized by the Delegation of the European Union in Pretoria and its main objective was to have thought-provoking exchanges and sharing of innovative approaches and best practices in the field of cultural and creative industries.

VentureStudio

B. K. Majumdar Institute of Business Administration



The students were shown a Physiotherapy clinic managed by blind people. The campus was also equipped with sewing machines and computers to train women in driving, stitching, embroidery, screen printing, videography-photography, and fabrication.
- A blood donation campaign was organized by AMSoM in association with the Indian Red Cross society on 5th September at the AMSoM campus. The drive gave a chance to students to make a difference in the lives of others and had a good participation by the students, faculty and staff.

Institute of Engineering and Technology

- Society for Research and Initiatives for Sustainable Technologies and Institutions (SRISTI) and Institute of Engineering and Technology (IET) co-organized the third summer school on 'Inclusive Innovation Programme' from 7th – 25th June at IET. The main purpose was to attract enthusiastic young minds to spend their summer break solving social challenges with possible mass impact in various fields. Students from Engineering, Design, Applied Science, and Social Science from across the country with an inclination to solve social challenges through technological innovations participated in this programme. IET student, Parth Patel was one of the participants and was involved in designing a foldable cart for mobile vendors.




Industrial Visits

B. K. Majumdar Institute of Business Administration

The entire value chain of production planning, manufacturing and packaging was illustrated to the students.
- AMSoM students during their visit to the Forbes Marshall plant were exposed to the entire manufacturing process. They were informed about the JIT, KAN BAN and various other operations expertise implemented in there plant. This plant is state of the art clean plant and one of the major steam equipment manufacturing plants of India.
- The AMSoM EMBA students were taken to Instaclique, an IT startup which is working on increasing the sales of online platforms like Flipkart, Lenkart, Myntra etc. The students were exposed to big data analysis tools and other internet sales acceleration tools which are being provided by this company to some of the largest e-commerce websites of India and abroad.
- This Volkswagen plant at Pune is one of the largest and arguably one of the most advanced Car manufacturing plants of India. The AMSoM EMBA students were taken on a one hour long plant tour wherein various car assembly, painting, and quality control facilities were shown. The plant was built on concept of "THINK BLUE" wherein the entire plant is built to conserve maximum resources and energy while recycling all the waste that the plant produces. The students were exposed to state of the art robots and systems that were being used for assembling and doing quality control of the cars.

SCHEDULE 24: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention and on the accrual method of accounting.

2. FIXED ASSETS

- 2.1 Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition inclusive of freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition.
- 2.2 Fixed Assets received by way of Donation are capitalized at values stated, by corresponding credit to Capital/Corpus Fund.
- 2.3 Capital Work in progress includes cost of fixed assets that are not ready for intended use as at Balance Sheet date and is disclosed under Fixed Assets.

3. DEPRECIATION

- 3.1 Depreciation of addition to Fixed Assets has been provided on pro rata basis i.e. from the date of put to use.
- 3.2 The depreciation has been provided on Written Down Value Method at the rate as specified in the Guidance Note on "Accounting for Schools" issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India except (a) depreciation on Building Improvements, which has been provided at Straight Line Method over a period of 10 years; (b) ERP Software is being amortized over the period of 5 years; (c) Other Software and Assets given to employees which are being amortized over the period of 3 years;(d) Depreciation on Scientific Equipment is provided at 20%.
- 3.3 Assets costing individually Rs.5,000/- or less, wherever applicable, are depreciated at the rate of 100%.
- 3.4 Depreciation in Income & Expenditure Account is net of the amount of depreciation transferred from related earmarked funds.

4. REVENUE RECOGNITION

- 4.1 Fees from Students are recognized on accrual basis and accounted for on the basis of the period of academic year.
- 4.2 Interest on Investments is recognized on accrual basis.

5. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS

- 5.1 Transactions denominated in foreign currency are accounted at the exchange rate prevailing at the date of transaction. Foreign currency monetary items outstanding at the balance sheet date are restated at the yearend rates.
- 5.2 Income or Expense, if any, on account of exchange difference either on settlement or on translation is charged to revenue.

6. INVESTMENTS

Long Term Investments are carried at cost.

7. EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

7.1 **Defined Contribution Plan**

Retirement Benefit such as Provident Fund, which is defined contribution, is provided for on actual basis as and when the contribution accrues.

7.2 **Defined Benefits Plan**

Gratuity, a defined benefit obligation, is funded through LIC of India. The liability is accrued and provided for on the basis of actuarial valuation report, as at the Balance Sheet date. Accumulated Leave encashment benefit payable on death/retirement is accounted on accrual basis as per the Actuarial Valuation report.

8. GOVERNMENT GRANT

Government grant related to revenue is recognized in the Income & Expenditure Account in the year of accrual/receipt.

9. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

Provision is made for all known liabilities. Contingent liabilities, if any, are disclosed in the accounts by way of a note.
